REMARKS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR THE GOOD AND WELFARE OF THE BOROUGH [Reported by Deputy Borough Clerk Patricia A. McKim.]

54. Julie Balay, 144 County Road said with the support of the town, she would like to hold a 10K race on October 14th in Cresskill to raise funds for HSA Merritt School. They've been having similar races in Tenafly and Demarest for years and raise approximately 30K for their schools. It takes a lot of work and with limited time to plan a bigger event, this year the proceeds would only benefit the HSA Merritt School. If this becomes a yearly event and grows as we would hope, we would get the high school track team and the CEF involved and the proceeds could benefit all the schools. The race should be over within 2 hours and I've laid out a couple of routes to review with the Police. Chief Wrixon said Lt. Cebulski will go over the possible routes with her as well as any traffic support necessary by the Police. Council Member Brennan said utilizing the Community Center and pavilion for this event would be a good idea. Mayor Romeo suggested they put something in the October newsletter and possibly have a table at Cresskill Day to promote it. The Mayor and Council agreed to the race, Ms. Balay just needs to coordinate it with the Police.

Howard Tiedemann, 101 7th Street said the American Legion breakfast starts this Sunday from 8 am to 12 noon and runs every Sunday through December.

Chief Wrixon said the National POW/MIA Recognition Day ceremony is in October at the American Legion where Veteran soldiers from all wars trade places throughout the day standing guard in front of two chairs with the POW/MIA flag on them.

Livio Laganis, 201 Madison Avenue asked the status of the Madison Avenue project. Mayor Romeo said they have cleared the property and construction should begin soon.
