38. Richard Calabrese, 42 Engle Street asked what ECode360 is on the Cresskill website and why does it say "legally bound by the terms of use." Borough Clerk Nasuto said it's a link to General Code which publishes our ordinances and puts them in our codebook and it's probably just a standard statement. Attorney Salvatore said General Code publishes many municipalities' codebooks.

Mr. Calabrese said the house on Engle Street that had the trash on their lawn had furniture on their lawn on Sunday, and bulk pickup isn't until Friday. Chief Wrixon said they sent an officer there the night he reported the trash, took pictures, and turned everything over to the Property Maintenance Officer. I don't know what happened from there, but I'll look into it. Mr. Calabrese said Chapter 202-2 in the codebook is "Property Maintenance" and covers quality of life issues, but nobody obeys them.

Robert Ulshoefer, 320 11th Street said people are putting bags of recyclables at the DPW but it's supposed to be in containers, not plastic bags. Can the DPW let them know not to use plastic bags? Mayor Romeo said he will speak to Supt. Terhune about it.
