REMARKS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR THE GOOD AND WELFARE OF THE BOROUGH [Reported by Deputy Borough Clerk Patricia A. McKim.]

31. Mayor Romeo said we are looking for volunteers for Cresskill's quasquicentennial celebration. We will have many events throughout the whole year.

Denise Villani, 41 Maple Street thanked the Police and all the respondents who answered the call for the unfortunate incident that happened at the High School track on July 5<sup>th</sup>.

Richard Calabrese, 42 Engle Street spoke about his issue with containers that have the proper recycling number on them, but are not accepted at the Recycling Center. But people put them in their recycle bins at the curb and they get picked up. I was given a pamphlet that said no food containers were allowed regardless of the recycle number.

Mr. Calabrese asked why the Peddler property is going to have 5 houses on it with bulk variances. Why can't it be 3 houses with no variances? Mayor Romeo said it sounds like a big thing but it's not. There will be 3 houses facing 12<sup>th</sup> Street, 2 houses facing Knickerbocker and the 3<sup>rd</sup> building will be where the old gas station was and will be a small professional building that looks like a house.

Mr. Calabrese said the downtown affordable overlay zone on Legion Drive is going to have 18 condos. What does affordable overlay zone mean? Mayor Romeo said when your COAH time is due, the Affordable Housing Council gives you a certain amount of time, and based on your vacant land, tell you by court order, how many affordable housing units you must put in. The last time they were here they had satellite views which showed the vacant land in town. They picked the Hamrah's property. The builder has to make 20% of the condos COAH. The town will get some money from this to build low income housing in town. The empty lot where the food pantry was is going to be a small group home for challenged adults who need on-site supervision which is handled by the United Way. We'll get double credit for that and it will go towards our 2025 COAH obligation. This will not impact the schools because they're adults. We are only one of six towns in Bergen County that have met their 3<sup>rd</sup> round obligation.

Mr. Calabrese asked about the Madison Avenue widening project. Mayor Romeo said we're still waiting on the County's approval. That project was supposed to start right after Emerson's project, which is done and they're still not here.
