In order to obtain the waiver, the Homeowner must execute the Certification of Necessity, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if set forth in its entirety; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a Certified to be true copy of this Resolution be served upon Bob Rusch, Construction Code Official; Allison Altano, CFO; Edward Wrixon, Borough Administrator; and the Borough of Cresskill Building Department. WHEREAS, the Borough of Cresskill, pursuant to Ordinance, has created the Cresskill Volunteer Ambulance & Emergency Services Company (hereinafter "CVAES"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the above individual is hereby appointed by Mayor Benedict Romeo and each respective appointment is confirmed by the Council, subject to the respective appointee complying with the Cresskill Revised General Ordinances, specifically, §15-1 et seq., specifically §15-5, Requirements of the Volunteer Division; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a Certified to be True Copy of this Resolution be served upon each Appointee; Fire Chief Christopher Ulshoefer; Harold Laufeld, CFO; Edward Wrixon, Borough Administrator; Francesca Maragliano, Borough Clerk.

17. WHEREAS, Bergen County, through its Department of Safety, Division of Communication, currently operates a state-of-the-art public safety operation center (Trunked Radio System), providing communication and dispatch services to municipalities and throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, Bergen County has proposed a Shared Service and Consolidation Act Agreement, which will promote the use of shared services which will reduce expenses funded by Property Tax Payers; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-5, Bergen County and Borough have each adopted Resolutions to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council does hereby agree to authorize the Borough to enter into a Shared Services Agreement with Bergen County so that the municipality's essential services will have the benefit of utilizing Bergen County's Trunked Radio System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Council does hereby authorize Mayor Benedict Romeo, Borough Administrator Edward Wrixon, or Deputy Police Chief, James Domville, to execute the Shared Service Agreement with Bergen County for the use of Bergen County's Trunked Radio System; and

23. Bernard Yoo, 81 Rose Street asked if the town lost a lot of equipment from Tropical Storm Ida. Mayor Romeo said a fire truck and some DPW equipment, plus the damage to the DPW garage which is under repair. Clerk Maragliano said we have flood insurance, and the paperwork is still being processed. Mr. Yoo asked if we've heard the timelines for repairing County Road in Demarest and Hillside Avenue in Alpine which is causing more traffic through Cresskill. Chief Wrixon said probably 3 to 6 months at least. Mr. Yoo asked if we could have more crossing guards or Police around Merritt School due to the extra traffic. Chief Wrixon said we do not have extra crossing guards or Police, but you should ask the school if they can assist in any way.

Borough Historian Tom Sites asked if a report was made by Borough Engineer Paul Azzolina or DPW Superintendent Jim Noseworthy on the conditions at the Tallman House. Mayor Romeo said Mr. Azzolina is currently writing up a report.
