BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor, Borough Clerk and Chief Financial Officer be and hereby are authorized to sign jointly all checks and notes drawn against the Borough of Cresskill and Municipal Swim Club Accounts for the year 2022 with the exception of payroll checks, which shall be signed only by the Chief Financial Officer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Council, and the Deputy Borough Clerk be and hereby are authorized to sign jointly the aforementioned checks and notes in the absence of the Mayor, Borough Clerk and Chief Financial Officer.

47. WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill deems it advisable and in the public interest to keep surplus monies invested in interest bearing accounts or securities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill, New Jersey, that the Chairman of the Finance Committee and/or the Chief Financial Officer are, and they are hereby, authorized to invest Borough funds from time to time when available for such investments and not required for normal use by the Municipality; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a report of all such investments be submitted to the Mayor and Council for ratification at the next succeeding Council meeting following the date of investment of funds.

48. BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill, in order to realize the greatest possible interest from Borough funds, that the Chief Financial Officer or, in his/her absence, the Borough Clerk, be and hereby are authorized to transfer funds in official depositories by telephonic or electronic instructions from checking to savings accounts as well as from savings to checking accounts.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the Borough of Cresskill intends to evidence an agreement with the referenced State contract vendors through this resolution and a properly executed purchase order, which agreement shall be subject to all the conditions applicable to the current State Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Cresskill authorize the Borough's Departments to purchase items from an approved New Jersey State Contract Vendor within the thresholds hereinafter stated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Cresskill hereby authorizes the Borough's Departments to purchase the necessary items from an approved New Jersey State Contract Vendor within the thresholds specifically stated in a purchase order; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Cresskill, that pursuant to the rules of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey no amount of this contract shall be chargeable or certified until such time as goods are ordered or otherwise called for prior to placing the order and a certification of availability of funds is made by the Chief Financial Officer upon receipt of a properly executed purchase order. The individual issuing the purchase order shall have the obligation of securing the necessary certification as to the availability of funds from the Chief Financial Officer; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of this authorization shall be until December 31, 2022 or upon the expiration of the vendor's State Contract, whichever event occurs first.

52. BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor and Borough Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized to sign all standard contracts and agreements, after approval of the Borough Attorney, on behalf of the Borough of Cresskill.

53. BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill in the County of Bergen and the State of New Jersey, that in accordance with the provisions of NJSA 54:4-67, interest will be charged at the rate of Eight (8%) percent per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of delinquent taxes, sewer rentals and assessments and Twelve (12%) percent on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00 for delinquent taxes, sewer rentals and assessments, except that no interest shall be charged if payment of any installment is made within the tenth calendar day following the date upon which the same became payable; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the office of the Collector of Taxes is closed on the tenth of February, May, August or November, then the forgiveness of interest above described shall be extended to include the first business day thereafter; and

BE IT RESOLVED that the amount of interest to be paid at the rate of Eight (8%) percent or Twelve (12%) percent, as the case may be, as provided for in this Resolution, shall be computed from the first day of the current quarter unless the taxes for such quarter are paid during the first ten (10) days of said quarter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tax Collector be authorized to hold the annual Tax Sale on delinquent taxes as required by P.L. 1997 Chapter 99.

56. BE IT RESOLVED, as provided in Revised Statutes 40:55D-56, that the Borough Clerk is hereby designated as the official to make and issue certificates as to whether or not subdivisions have been approved by the Planning Board or Governing Body; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the absence of the Borough Clerk, the Deputy Borough Clerk is hereby designated as such official.

57. WHEREAS, the Borough of Cresskill is a current member of the Bergen County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Fund Bylaws require the appointment of a Risk Management Consultant, and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Cresskill desires the services of a Risk Management Consultant to perform various services in connection with its membership in the insurance fund; and

WHEREAS, the judgmental nature of the duties of Risk Management Consultant renders comparative bidding impractical.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Cresskill does hereby appoint Frank Covelli, Professional Insurance Associates (PIA), A Division of World Insurance Associates, LLC, 429 Hackensack Street, PO Box 818, Carlstadt, New Jersey as its Risk Management Consultants for a one-year term; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a Risk Management Consultant's Agreement and to cause a notice of this decision to be published according to State statutes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to Professional Insurance Associates (PIA), A Division of World Insurance Associates, LLC and to the Bergen County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund.

58. WHEREAS, the Borough of Cresskill, referred to as the "Borough", has elected membership to the Bergen County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund, hereinafter referred to as the "Fund", for the provision of insurance coverages, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:10-6 et.seq.; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Bylaws of the Fund and the regulations promulgated by the New Jersey Departments of Banking and Insurance and Community Affairs that require the Borough to appoint a Fund Commissioner and Alternate Commissioner to represent the Borough relative to the functions of the Fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill do hereby appoint James Cleary as Fund Commissioner and Kathy Schultz-Rummel as the Alternate Fund Commissioner for a one-year term commencing January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

59. WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 requires that each municipality designate a Cash Management Plan for the deposit of local monies; and

WHEREAS, the Cash Management Plan for the Borough of Cresskill is on file with the Borough Clerk and Chief Financial Officer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill adopt the Cash Management Plan for the year 2022.

60. Payments Between Meeting Dates

WHEREAS, it becomes necessary at times to issue checks for certain fixed charges which are due on periodic dates, such as County Taxes, Payroll and other miscellaneous items, which dates frequently occur between Council meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the proper Borough Officials be and are hereby authorized to issue and sign checks for payment when such payments become due for ratification at the next following meeting.

61. BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council, Borough of Cresskill, that the Borough, utilizing the bid threshold of \$44,000, hereby appoints Joseph Citro as the Qualified Purchasing Agent authorized to exercise the duties of a purchasing agent pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2(30), with specific relevance to the authority, responsibility and accountability of the purchasing activity of the contracting unit in accordance with the salary ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:34-5.2, the Cresskill Borough Clerk is authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this resolution and a copy of Joseph Citro's certification to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.

62. BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council, Borough of Cresskill, that Azzolina & Feury, Inc. be, and hereby is, authorized to update the Cresskill Tax Map, the Zoning Map of Cresskill, and the Election District Map of Cresskill in order to reflect any changes approved by the Planning Board, Zoning Board of Adjustment and Mayor and Council for 2022.

63. BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council, Borough of Cresskill, that James Noseworthy be, and hereby is, appointed as Recycling Coordinator commencing January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

64. Fee for Returned Checks

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:5-18 provides for the imposition of a service charge to be added to any amount owing to the municipality if payment tendered on the account was tendered by a check which was returned for insufficient funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill that the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to impose a \$20.00 fee for all returned checks to any Accounts of the Municipality.

65. WHEREAS, per N.J.A.C. 5:30-9A.6 and 5:31-4.1 the Borough of Cresskill is not requiring vendors to sign the "Claimant's Certification and Declaration" on purchase orders under \$2,650.00 except for the following:

1) Employee reimbursements and services by other individuals.

WHEREAS, the Borough shall have the discretion to require vendor or claimant certification as the Borough deems necessary and appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill that this regulation becomes effective.

66. Bergen County Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Resolution

WHEREAS, the police departments in Bergen County have a day to day responsibility to provide for the security of lives and property, for the maintenance and preservation of the public peace and order, and

WHEREAS, Law Enforcement Officials also have a responsibility to provide for preparedness against natural emergencies, such as floods, hurricanes, earthquakes, major storms, etc., man-made causes, civil unrest, and civil disobedience such as riot, strikes, jail or prison riots, train wrecks, aircraft crashes, major fires, ethnic disorders, riots, terrorist incidents and bombings, state and national emergencies, and

WHEREAS, the Bergen County Police Chief’s Association has proposed a Mutual Aid Plan and Rapid Deployment Force to deal with these emergencies, and

WHEREAS, this Plan is adopted in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-156, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-156.1, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-156.4 and N.J.S.A. App. A:9-40.6, and

WHEREAS, this Plan will provide a uniform procedure for the coordination of the requesting, dispatching, and utilization of law enforcement personnel and equipment whenever a local law enforcement agency requires mutual aid assistance from any other jurisdiction, both contiguous and non-contiguous, in the event of an emergency, riot or disorder, in order to protect life and property, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill to participate in a Mutual Aid Plan and Rapid Deployment Force in accordance with the Plan as submitted by the Bergen County Police Chief’s Association.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill that the police Department of the Borough of Cresskill, under the direction of the Chief of Police, cooperate with the Bergen County Police Chief’s Association to create an Interlocal Services Agreement with all municipalities in the County of Bergen in order to put into place the Mutual Aid Plan and Rapid Deployment Force, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of the Resolution be forwarded to the County Executive, the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the County Prosecutor, and all municipalities in the County of Bergen.

67. INTERBORO MUTUAL AID GROUP AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the undersigned municipalities, its fire departments and respective fire companies to enter into a mutual aid and assistance program pursuant to and required be law as set forth in NJAC 5:75A-2.2; and

WHEREAS, this agreement is intended to supersede any earlier agreements which may have been signed between the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, this agreement shall be by and between the following boroughs, towns, municipalities, fire departments and fire companies and the parties agree to be bound thereby;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to have an agreement to define the obligations and duties of the parties of the Interboro Mutual Aid Group;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the parties covenant and agree as follows:

(1) Call for assistance: All calls for assistance among the Mutual Aid members shall be made through the dispatch facility of the department or municipality for the department or municipality requiring assistance to the dispatch facility for the town from which assistance is requested. The request for assistance shall come from the Fire Chief or other ranking officer in charge of the fire or emergency incident. The town(s) requesting the assistance shall give the following information: location of the fire or emergency incident, route to be taken, and type of equipment requested. Towns requesting assistance shall have a police radio car on the town boundary line to meet the apparatus and escort them to the location of the fire or emergency incident if needed.

(2) The Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief, Assistant Fire Chief or ranking officer in charge of the fire department that called for assistance shall be in charge of the fire or emergency incident in accordance with NJAC 5:75 et seq. Apparatus reporting in from other towns shall report to the Staging Officer or other appropriate Commander at the scene prior to placing apparatus and personnel to work.

(3) There shall be no charge imposed against any member municipality or department receiving personnel, apparatus or equipment.

(4) Cost recovery may only be imposed where permitted by the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code; federal, state and local laws allowing for cost recovery involving hazardous material incidents; or cost recovery that is considered recoverable under law from responsible parties.

(5) Each of the aforementioned municipalities agrees to assume the cost of loss or damage to its own equipment.

(6) It is understood and agreed that in the event of the failure of any of the departments to respond to the call for assistance, the department and municipality failing to respond shall in no way be liable.

(7) It is understood that the Agreement will take effect and be operative by all municipalities and departments that sign same until such time as any municipality or department provides notice of their intent to withdraw from the mutual aid group. A 30-day written notice shall be given by any party to this Agreement of their intention to withdraw from this Agreement. The agreement shall remain in full force thereafter as regards the remaining signators.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Mayor and Council of all aforementioned municipalities.

68. A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF CRESSKILL AWARDING A CONTRACT TO AND APPOINTING DR. BARBARA SCHREIBMAN TO THE POSITION OF MEDICAL DIRECTOR OF THE CRESSKILL VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE & EMERGENCY SERVICES CO. (CVAES) OPERATING UNDER CRESSKILL FIRE DEPARTMENT EMS (CFDEMS)

WHEREAS, the Borough of Cresskill (“Borough”) is required pursuant to State law and the regulations of the State Department of Health and Senior Services to employ a medical director certified in emergency medicine for the Cresskill Volunteer Ambulance & Emergency Services Co. (“CVAES”) operating under Cresskill Fire Department EMS (“CFDEMS”); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough have determined that employing a part-time Medical Director for the CFDEMS is in the best interest of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, said services are recognized as “professional services” as same shall be rendered by persons authorized by law to practice a recognized profession, whose practice is regulated by law, and the performance of which services requires knowledge of an advance type in a field of learning acquired by a prolonged formal course of specialized instruction and study, pursuant to and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2(6); and

WHEREAS, the Borough is empowered by law to appoint and employ professionals, technical advisors and experts as the Borough may determine to be necessary for its efficient operation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 15, Cresskill Volunteer Ambulance & Emergency Services Co. operating under Cresskill Fire Department EMS (CFDEMS), of the Municipal Code of the Borough, the Borough is authorized to appoint members to the CFDEMS; and

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to appoint Dr. Barbara Schreibman, Assistant Director of Emergency Medicine at Englewood Hospital and Medical Center, to the position as Medical Director for the CFDEMS to perform such professional medical services in accordance with guidelines from the Supervisor of the CFDEMS, attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Schreibman possesses the requisite expertise and licenses to serve as Medical Director; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough are desirous of awarding a contract to Dr. Schreibman to serve as Medical Director in accordance with the procedures mandated under the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. requires that the resolution awarding contracts for “professional services” without competitive bidding and the agreement between the parties must be available for public inspection; and

WHEREAS, the services as Medical Director will be performed by Dr. Schreibman at an annual cost of \$5,000, which amount is less than the threshold of \$17,500 under the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-To-Play Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., and, therefore, the contract is not subject to the provisions of the New Jersey Local Unit Pay-To-Play Law; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that funds are available for this purpose,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Cresskill, as follows:

1. That Dr. Barbara Schreibman be awarded a contract and appointed to the position of Medical Director for the CFDEMS.
2. That Dr. Schreibman shall perform the services described in a memo, attached hereto, from the Supervisor of the CFDEMS for the annual compensation in the amount of \$5,000.
3. That a notice of the contract award shall be published and this resolution must be available for public inspection, in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.
4. That the Chief Financial Officer has certified that current funds are available for this purpose.
5. That no further action of the Borough shall be required.
