# **FIRE/EMS**

## **STOP THE BLEED® MONTH**

- Presented by the Cresskill Fire Department
- Every second counts during a medical emergency involving severe bleeding. During Stop the Bleed® Month, the Cresskill Fire Department encourages all residents to learn simple lifesaving skills that can help save a life before first responders arrive.
- **What Is Stop the Bleed®?**
- Stop the Bleed® is a national awareness campaign designed to teach the public how to recognize and control severe bleeding during emergencies such as:

- Motor vehicle accidents
  - Falls and traumatic injuries
  - Workplace incidents
  - Household accidents
  - Natural disasters and emergencies
- Uncontrolled bleeding can become life-threatening within minutes. Quick action by bystanders can make the difference between life and death.

### **Three Quick Steps to Help Save a Life**

#### 1. Call 911

- Immediately notify emergency responders.

#### 2. Apply Pressure

- Use clean cloths, gauze, or your hands to apply firm, direct pressure to the wound.

#### 3. Use a Tourniquet if Necessary

- If bleeding cannot be controlled, a tourniquet may help stop life-threatening blood loss.

### **Why Training Matters**

- Learning basic bleeding control skills empowers residents to act confidently during emergencies while waiting for EMS personnel to arrive. Just like CPR, Stop the Bleed® training helps build a safer and more prepared community.

### **Get Involved**

- The Cresskill Fire Department encourages residents, schools, businesses, and community organizations to participate in bleeding control awareness and training opportunities throughout the month.
- Prepared citizens save lives.
- Remember: “The person next to a victim may be the one who saves them.”
- Stay informed. Stay prepared. Stay safe.
