- 20. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF CRESSKILL THROUGH THE CRESSKILL POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY, LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE, 1033 PROGRAM TO ENABLE THE CRESSKILL POLICE DEPARTMENT TO REQUEST AND AQUIRE EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSES EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the United Stated Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program (the 1033 "Program") to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies ("LEAs"); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county law enforcement agencies to obtain property that might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no to municipal and county law enforcement agencies, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRESSKILL that the Cresskill Police Department is hereby authorized to enroll in the 1033 Program for a one-year period from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Cresskill Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire items of non-controlled property designated "DEMIL A," which may include office supplies, office furniture, computers, electronic equipment, generators, field packs, non-military vehicles, clothing, traffic and transit signal systems, exercise equipment,

storage devices and containers, tools, medical and first aid equipment and supplies, personal protection equipment and supplies, respirators, binoculars, and any other supplies or equipment of a non-military nature identified by the Cresskill Police Department, if it shall become available within the period of time for which this Resolution authorizes, based on the needs of the Cresskill Police Department, without restriction; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Cresskill Police Department is hereby authorized to acquire the following "DEMIL B through Q" property, if it shall become available within the period of time for which this Resolution authorizes; and

BE IT FURTHUER RESOLVED that the property available through the program, DEMIL A through Q" is attached hereto; and

BE IT FURTHUR RESOLVED that the Cresskill Police Department shall develop and implement a full training plan and policy for the maintenance and use of the acquired property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Cresskill Police Department shall provide a quarterly accounting of all property obtained through the 1033 Program which shall be available to the public upon request; and

BE IT FURTHUR RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be valid to authorize requests to acquire (1) "DEMIL A" property that may be made available through the 1033 Program and (2) "DEMIL B through Q" property both of which that may be made available through the 1033 Program during the time period for which this Resolution authorizes, with program participation and all property request authorization terminating on December 31, 2023.

REMARKS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR THE GOOD AND WELFARE OF THE BOROUGH [Reported by Deputy Borough Clerk Patricia A. McKim.]

27. Carole Sommer, 262 Piermont Road thanked Mayor Romeo and Fire Chief Ulshoefer for helping to avoid flooding in her area over the weekend. Mayor Romeo said we're investigating putting up a wall but there are a lot of DEP restrictions. Mayor Romeo said we had a call with the Army Corp. of Engineers last week and for the study it will probably take two years to determine if they are going to commit money to us. Ms. Sommer said the developer for the old Frick property was denied putting in 90 units by the DEP. Now they are looking for approval of 40 units and allow for discharge of stormwater runoff into freshwater wetlands in nearby springs. Mayor Romeo said if it's something we can get involved in, we'll ask what the effect is on Cresskill. We'll have to see what the DEP says.

David Spelbrink, 156 South Street said the lights used for soccer on Ackerman Field were taken away last week and we weren't notified. Mayor Romeo said we purchased those lights for emergencies. We lent them to you for the fall, the lights were left on all night, almost seized the engine, and had to be repaired. Neighbors and Care One complain about the noise from Ackerman Field. We're prepping the fields for the fall and will be ruined if we put you there. Mr. Spelbrink said the lights turned off by themselves and the seized machine was due to running out of gas. Mayor Romeo said Bryan Field and other school fields need to be repaired and I don't know when the BOE will do that. Mayor Romeo said we can put the lights back for about two weeks, but we need to work out a better schedule. If the fields could rest until fall, we would be in good shape.
