24. Anthony Barbarise, 240 County Road said there's an accumulation of garbage in the gutter along Union Avenue that never gets cleaned. Due to the parked cars, the street sweeper cannot get to the curb. The trash in the gutters eventually feeds into the Haworth Reservoir which is where we get our drinking water. The microplastics that get into the drinking water get ingested because they cannot be filtered out. Our community deserves to have clean drinking water and cleaning the gutters is a part of the solution. The overflowing garbage cans are contributing to the problem. Mayor Romeo said Chief Domville and Supt. Noseworthy are taking measures to deal with the problem. We're also contacting the GRK Grill landlord to clean up their property.

Bill Celentano of the CEC said the NJEPA recently did an environmental study and Veolia has not been the most egregious dealing with chemicals in the water, but the water quality is still above board. Also, the CEC has reached out on social media to remind everyone that this is your town, and you should clean up after yourselves.

Carole Sommer, 262 Piermont Road thanked all the municipal departments that kept the area from flooding after this last big storm.
